

Dr Froso Argyri is currently a Greek language teacher at St Catherine's British Embassy School in Athens, teaching Greek as a second language to young bilinguals. She has also taught Greek as a second/foreign language in the Edinburgh Greek School for about 4 years.

She holds an MSc in Applied Linguistics from the Department of Linguistics and English Language, the University of Edinburgh, Scotland and a PhD in Developmental Linguistics also from the University of Edinburgh. Her Doctorate thesis was on the Greek/English bilingual simultaneous acquisition of morphosyntax and syntax-discourse interface structures. Part of the thesis has been presented in several conferences (e.g. International Symposium in Bilingualism, GALA, ISTAL) and in the 'Bilingualism: Language and Cognition' Journal.

Her research focuses on the cognitive and linguistic aspects of bilingualism as well as on the role of various factors affecting the course of bilingual acquisition, including age of onset and amount of language input. The findings of this collaborative research with leading experts in the field (Prof. Tsimpli, Prof. Sorace, Prof. Della Sala, Prof. Hulk, Dr. Cornips, Dr. Treccani & Dr. Unsworth) have been presented and published in conference proceedings (BUCLD, GALANA) as well as in journals.

She is also very keen on disseminating research findings on bilingualism and bilingual children to parents, teachers and other interested parties.
