Topography: very close to the university- the majority of the people who pass by this street are young










# INSIDE SPACE: ART CAFÉ

#### TOPOGRAPHY

•Center of the city – Tsimiski street

Located on the first floor of an old building
Many people passed by the street without noticing it
After 8 years of insisting on its artistic theme, it has become well-known to the young people



#### WHAT INSPIRED HIM TO CREATE AN ART CAFÉ?

"Back in th 80's, while I was studying Theatre in the USA, **close to the university**, there was a 'στέκι'/hub where students and young artists used to meet". -George Kiourtsidis

"We needed a place of meeting and communicating with other people. We didn't want to be **strangers in our own city**". –George Kiourtsidis

"We wanted to create an artistic place/cafe, where people would come, **exchange ideas, and discuss about what is going on in the city**". –George Kiourtsidis

### GENERAL INFO

Graffiti has its roots in ancient times, with examples dating back to Ancient Egypt, Ancient Greece and the Roman Empire





### CONTEMPORARY GRAFFITI

•60's: It appeared in America when people began writing their names on walls all over New York(tags).

•70's: they painted on subway trains

•80's: artists use building roofs or canvases. Galleries begin to showcase graffiti as artwork.



## TYPES OF GRAFFITI

- spray paint in aerosol cans is the number one medium for graffiti. From this commodity comes different styles, technique, and abilities to form master works of graffiti.
- A "**tag**" is the most basic writing of an artist's name, it is simply a handstyle.
- Stencils are also widely used





More elaborate paintings that have elevated graffiti into a form of art. More time consuming, not easy to do in public places.



### ANONYMITY

Graffiti artists constantly have the looming threat of facing consequences for displaying their graffiti. Many choose to protect their identities by remaining anonymous. One of them is Banksy, who continues to remain faceless in today's society




#### "VANDALISM"



Loba team whose paintings are in the city of Thessaloniki, the town of Naousa and art galleries in London.


## ARTIST: KOSTIS EDI

#### TATTOO ART IN THE CITY OF THESSALONIKI

Through my research I'm going to present tattoo art as a form of great influence upon youth and as a form of artistic expression that constantly gains ground and develops steadily into a science.



#### TATTOO ARTIST INTERVIEW

Vagelis is a young and prominent tattoo artist and he is talking about tattoo art in Thessaloniki and the youth's response to this kind of art.

As he reports:

- "Besides the fact that the avocation with the tattoo art can provide you money, it fills me with joy and completes him as a person, which is priceless. You have the permission to leave your mark permanently!"
- "Tattoos are much more acceptable in the youth society in comparison to the past"
- "Tattoo as a form of art can either be a matter of ideology or a matter of trend. Each one of us decides it through his/her attitude towards it and the choice of specific designs."

He also cites the view of:

• "Thessaloniki undoubtedly consists a place of artistic expression and creation, based on its picturesque places (like white tower and Ano poli) and artistically decorated spots."

Albert studies here in Greece and he is going to provide some information concerning tattoo art in Connecticut, U.S.A.


Through the eye of a foreigner he stated that:

- "It is very common amongst young people to have a tattoo in both countries, in the form of expression"
- "At first it was an ideology issue but nowadays its more a kind of trend"
- "The main and most obvious difference between Thessaloniki and Connecticut is the choice of designs and trends. In the U.S.A. it is so very usual to see the American flag tattooed on somebody's body whilst in Greece it is certainly unlike."
- "In the U.S.A. there are problems concerning tattoos when submitting for a job position and that makes them more close-minded in comparison to Greece"

A hub/place of socializing, discussing, articulating ideas but primarily expressing themselves liberally, not under the umbrella of a commercialized frame.



#### The group acquired the technical equipment that was indispensable for the projections by it's own means. A collective effort. The University abstained from granting the material and merely acquiesced in providing the space.



#### YOUTH AND CINEMA IN CONNECTICUT

Cinema is seen under a positive light due to the advancement of technological equipment as well as the fact that is has become "more affordable and more accessible". Today anyone can make his own movie and be a creator!

#### Films shot in Connecticut: "Dudley Town"

"Many people tried to make movies along the years but nobody was allowed in the property. However, young people broke in the property and shot an entire film."

"This could never be shot or distributed by a film company; it could only be done by young amateur people who were willing to risk it. They released it without the help of any cooperation so nobody would be in trouble except for them."

#### DIRECTOR'S INTERVIEW

Kostas Karydas has directed several award-winning short-films as well as commercials, most of them shot in Thessaloniki.

Notably, he distinguishes "Wake up" and "The Activists" from his entire filmography.



### THE NOTION OF SPACE AND CINEMA

"More often than not a location inspires an artist profoundly and simply out of an external locale, ideas emerge."

External aspect of the city of Thessaloniki: "fascinating and inspiring".

Especially "the sea and the seafront constitute a largely influential part of the city".





Referred to the idea of the **city's sentiment**: People are unified under a unanimous sentiment where the city's heart beats. This sentiment is forged/created along with the city's architecture.

"One can encounter art in numerous places in Thessaloniki. Predominantly, youth artistic hubs are to be found in rooftops, basements, bars for movie projections and discussions; nonetheless, none of them has yet been established as permanent."
