Research Interests

My main research focuses on the relationship between language, emotion, and mental illness. I follow an interdisciplinary approach, which combines insights and methods from the fields of Cognitive Linguistics, Discourse Analysis, and Social Semiotics. My thesis explores the role of figurative language –mainly metaphor and metonymy– in the expression of an intense and traumatic experience like depression. I investigate the interplay of metaphor and metonymy both linguistically, through written accounts, and multimodally, through visual representations in artworks, from people who have experienced the disorder. Additionally, I'm also interested in what role sadness –and its own role in social connection—plays in language use and comprehension.
